Sons of the Legion (S.A.L.) Corner - Bill Nenno, Commander Squadron 44

The Sons of the American Legion, Post 44, scheduled its regular meeting July17, 2012. Due to conflicting summer schedules a quorum was not met.

Membership: In spite of the lack of regular meetings the business of the S.A.L. continues as normal. We received our 2013 membership cards in July and we are now accepting payment for 2013 membership renewal. So far we have had 12 members renew.

Care Package Report – Marty Novak

We sent 63 Care Packages in July. That brings out total packages sent since beginning this project in September '03 to over 6,000. Our July Care Package day turned out to be very interesting. I did not make a trip to Sam's that month...any

doctor appointments...and we had to get everything from the local Wal-Mart. They didn't have everything we needed but I thought it would be enough because we usually have some donations and extra salsa. It wasn't! I took all the salsa Wal-Mart had and somehow Bullocks forgot to order the 2 cases they always give us so we didn't even have extra salsa to fill the boxes. We made it by the skin of our teeth and the tables were totally bare when we finished. I've got LOTS of shopping to do at Sam's this week. But we want to assure you that we always have room on our Care Package list. So if you know of anyone who is deployed, please give us their name and address and we will begin sending monthly Care Packages for as long as they are deployed. Thanks to you wonderful people who give us regular donations of money or goods for the packages, for Memorials and any kind of donation for this project because we couldn't continue to do this without your help. There isn't a lot we can do for our deployed Troops to make their lives easier and let them know we care...but these monthly Care Packages sure help. Our next packing date is August 8.

IT'S GETTING THAT TIME OF THE YEAR WHEN IT IS GETTING VERY HOT OVER THERE. WE STARTED SENDING NECK COOLERS IN OUR CARE PACKAGES IN APRIL AND WILL CONTINUE UNTIL ABOUT OCTOBER. IF YOU SEW AND WOULD LIKE TO MAKE NECK COOLERS PLEASE LET ME KNOW. I HAVE THE PATTERN IF YOU NEED ONE AND EVEN HAVE SOME OF THE CRYSTALS TO PUT INSIDE IF YOU NEED THEM.

CELL PHONES FOR SOLDIERS: We are an official collection site for CELL PHONES FOR SOLDIERS and we are continuing to collect cell phones that are no longer being used. There is a container just outside the door at the Post to deposit the cell phones. I have collected about 35cell phones from the container at the Post and will be sending them off soon. Thanks to all of you who are donating them. The cell phones are sent for recycling and the money is used to purchase Phone Cards for the soldiers. So far we have sent approximately 1,600 phone cards in our Care Packages. These Phone Cards can be used for calling from Iraq, Afghanistan, etc to the US or within the US. So if you have unused cell phones lying around, drop them off in our container and we'll take care of sending them off.

What is a Veteran: A Veteran...whether active duty, discharged, retired, or reserve...is someone who, at one point in their life, wrote a blank check made payable to "The United States of America" for an amount of "up to, and including his/her life." That is honor, and there are way too many people in this country today, who no longer understand that act..
